Zachariah Smith who stands indicted of grand larceny and who stands bound by recognizance entered into at the last Term of this Court with E. S. Fells J. T. Fells his securities for his appearance here this day to answer the Commonwealth of and concerning the larceny whereof he stands charged was solemnly called but came not. Whereupon it is ordered that a writ of Scire Facias be issued against the said Zachariah Smith and his said securities returnable here on the first day of April Term next.

Henry Carr who stands indicted of housebreaking was this day set to the Bar in custody of the jailer of this Court and being thereof arraigned pleaded not guilty to the indictment, and a panel of sixteen persons summoned by the Sheriff were examined by the Court and found free from all legal exception and qualified to serve as jurors according to law. Whereupon the accused peremptorily challenged four of the jurors and the remaining twelve jurors to wit Wm. Cobb, J. E. Westbrock, S. T. Basham, W. H. Miles, James E. Drake, R. L. Bryant, Henry Ferguson, Jas. E. Rowe, Orris Charles, James W. Gursley, R. M. Clayton & Samuel A. B. White were sworn the truth of and upon the promise to speak and having heard the evidence upon their oaths they say "We the jurors find the prisoner guilty and ascertain the term of his confinement in the Penitentiary to be two years." And thereupon it being demanded of the prisoner if any thing for himself he had or knew to say why the Court should not now proceed to pronounce judgment against him according to law and nothing being offered or alleged in delay of judgment it is considered by the Court that the said Henry Carr be imprisoned in the Penitentiary of this Commonwealth for the term of two years ascertained by the jurors in their verdict ascertained. And the Sheriff of this County is ordered to remove and safely convey the said Henry Carr as soon as possible after the adjournment of this Court from the jail of this County to the Penitentiary of this Commonwealth where he is to be kept imprisoned and treated in the manner directed by Law for the term aforesaid.
