

The account of Harriet A. Morris's Guardianship of John, James Morris, having been the subject of reports in the Clerk's Office, of the Circuit Court, filed therein, it was examined, confirmed, and ordered to be recorded.

William Vaughan, former, J. & Turner, J. H. Thomas, Harriet Bostwick, William, Mr. M. Vaughan, Perry & Bennett and John J. Seyer, were sworn in Special grand jury of inquiry for the body of said County, and having received their charge, withdrew and after sometime, returned into Court and presented that Jane Hunt on the 20th day of July 1873, in the said County, was value of the value of five hundred & fifty dollars of the goods and chattels of John J. Seyer, under the Special Control, Custody, & Keeping of the Roanoke Rail Road Company then and there being found, feloniously did steal, take & carry away from the said Section of Roanoke Rail Road Company against the peace & dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia, upon the return of H. C. Stokes, Thomas Baker, Peter was sworn in Court, and took before the Grand Jurors. They also found the following Indictments to be true: Indictment against Geo. R. & Frank J. Hunt, (alias Schiller) for grand larceny, "A true bill."

An Indictment against Jane Hunt for grand larceny, "A true bill." And the said grand jury having nothing further to present were discharged.

The said Will & Testament of James B. Williams did was then duly proved by the oath of Thomas J. Brister, one of the subscribing witnesses thereto, and having been previously proved by the oath of R. H. Holcomb another subscribing witness thereto, and is ordered to be recorded, and on the Motion of Sarah Ann Williams the Executrix therein named the said Court, according to law, and together with R. M. Stephenson and James H. Williams, her Secutors (who justified as such as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a Bond in the penalty of Five hundred dollars, conditioned according to law which day is ordered to be recorded. Certificate is granted the said Sarah Ann Williams, for obtaining a copy of the said Will, in due form.

Jane Hunt, who stands Indicted of Larceny was then duly set to the bar in view of the failure of the Court, and on her Motion, and for reason appearing to the Court, the trial is continued until the next term of this Court. And thereupon the said Jane Hunt, with Allen Murphy, James Hunt, Thos Hunt and Martha Whitehead her Secutors (who justified as such as to their sufficiency) were in Court severally acknowledged themselves indebted to the Commonwealth of Virginia, that is to say, the said Jane Hunt in the sum of Five hundred dollars and the said Allen Murphy, James Hunt, Thos Hunt and Martha Whitehead in the like sum of Five hundred dollars, of their respective goods and chattels bonds and securities to be levied to the use of the Commonwealth to be recorded.
