

make her personal appearance before this Court, on the first day of the next term thereof to answer the Commonwealth for the Tiding of which she stands charged and shall void, otherwise to remain in full force & Virtue.

Geo. R. Hunt alias Chilly & Frank S. Hunt alias Chilly, who stand indicted of grand larceny of the Tiding of this Court and as their report of for reasons appearing to the Court, the trial is continued until the next term of this Court, and thereupon the prisoners are remanded to jail.

Bonham Bogan, Elisha Britt, Geo. Hunt, W. R. Barlow, H. C. Stokes, Thos. Baker, Henry Capen & A. R. Bace, have in Court acknowledged themselves indebted to the Commonwealth of Virginia in the sum of two hundred dollars each, to the kind of their goods and chattels, lands and tenements for the use of the said Commonwealth, but to be void if the said Bonham Bogan, Elisha Britt, Geo. Hunt, W. R. Barlow, H. C. Stokes, Thos. Baker, Henry Capen and A. R. Bace shall personally appear in this Court on the first day of the next term to testify on behalf of the Commonwealth, and not default against the Commonwealth, and not default against the Commonwealth.

Ordered that M. J. Butler, King Butler, Richard Butler and R. M. Stephenson, or any three of them, being first duly sworn for the purpose, do appraise all the goods & chattels of James B. Williams and return the appraisement under their hands according to law.

The Last Will & Testament of Sterling Sledge deceased was proved by the Oath John E. Rose of Wm. H. Robinson, the two subscribing witnesses thereto, and ordered to be recorded. And as there being no executor named therein, and the Will of George O. Sledge, who made last according to law, of request unto Joseph B. Prince & Joseph H. Prince, his Security (who justified as last as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Two Thousand Dollars, conditioned according to law, which bond is ordered to be recorded. Certificate is granted the said George O. Sledge for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of the said Sterling Sledge deceased with his Will aforesaid annexed in due form.

Ordered that James H. Harder, J. V. Leach, Geo. H. Hughes, John E. Prince and W. S. Adams, or any three of them, being first duly sworn for the purpose, do appraise all the goods & chattels of Sterling Sledge and return the appraisement under their hands according to law.

For reasons appearing to the Court it is ordered that J. B. Prince Guardian of Clara Ellis be allowed to expense the dollars of the principal of her personal Estate, for her support.
