

The Commissioners heretofore appointed to let to the lowest undertaker the building a bridge & embankment across Mills Creek near Stottoway Mills made the following report -
To the Hon. Judge of the County Court Southampton.

Term 1872. of County Court of Southampton County to let to the lowest undertaker the building a bridge & embankment across Mills Creek near Stottoway Mills with following specification to wit: The bridge to be 6 1/2 ft high from mud-sill to floor mudsill to be buried level with earth, 4 posts 8 x 10 - 2 Cap sills 8 x 10 ft long. 5 Stringers 3 x 10. 10 feet long. bridged floor to be 2 in. thick. Abutments of 2 in. plank. all the above timbers to be heart pine or Cypress except mud sills which may be sap. Stand rails 3 x 4 braced on bench plank, said rails to be heart. The embankment bridge to be 12 ft wide at top, the embankment to be level with floor of bridge from hill to hill and allowed to form a natural base. Beg leave to submit the following report. The above work was let to Mr. A. Carter for \$185. work to be completed by 15. Sept. 1873.
