The report of the Commissioners heretofore made assigning dower to Martha Nutter in the Estate of her deceased husband Wm. Nutter having been more than one month and no exceptions being filed therein, it was examined and confirmed.

Thomas Vaughan foreman, Wm. A. Bell, James W. Dwyer, Wm. N. Schell, James T. Mills and Robert M. Nash were sworn a special grand jury of inquest for the body of this County, and having received their charge withdrew, and after sometime returned into Court and presented

An Indictment against Cornelius Diggs for rape - "A true bill."

An Indictment against Lemuel Soyner for assault and battery - "A true bill."

They also made the following presentments to wit:

He present John C. Griffin for making an assault and battery upon Mr. M. Clayton the 22nd day of May 1873, in Southampton County, on the evidence of Richard Brister and George M. Spring sworn in Court and sent to the grand jury at their request.

He present Anthony Williams (Colo) for stealing taking and carrying away two pair shoes of the value of five dollars and twenty five cents - the property of C. C. Williams, on the 29th day of April 1873, in the County of Southampton on the evidence of Sam. Ticks and Sandy Shands (Colo) sworn in Court and sent to the Grand jury.

He present Nat. Felt for unlawfully but not feloniously defacing and injuring the dwelling house of James T. Mills on the night of the 21st of May 1873, on the evidence of Sam. T. Mills one of our body sworn in Court and sent to the jury.

And the said Grand jury, having nothing further to present were discharged.

Ordered that the presentment this day made by the Grand jury against Anthony Williams (Colo) be certified to a Justice of Peace, of this County, to be proceeded upon according to law.

Cornelius Diggs who stands indicted for rape this day appeared in Court according to the condition of his recognizance entered into before Mr. J. Butler a Justice of the Peace, for this County and on the motion of the said Cornelius Diggs, and for reasons appearing to the Court, his trial is continued till the first day of the next term of this Court, and thereupon the said Cornelius Diggs with Geo. Jordan, Henry Thomas and Geo. Hanne his securities herein in Court acknowledged themselves indebted to the Commonwealth of Virginia - That is to say the said Diggs in the sum of one hundred dollars and his said securities the like sum of one hundred dollars, of their respective goods and chattels lands and tenements to the use of the said Commonwealth to be rendered -
