

Building of a Bridge with Draw arch therein over said River, at said point, and the necessary Embankment, as referred to, and report to the Court. The Court reserving the right to approve or disapprove of the same, as to it may seem proper.

Ordered That J. M. Corbitt, out of the County, lay, pay to Joseph B. Prince, Three Hundred Dollars, on account of allowance for his services as Attorney for Commencement, for year 1873.

On the recommendation of W. E. Edwards, Jas & Wm of D. S. Pipe Commissioners, who have heretofore let out the repairs to the Embankment at Jerusalem; It is by the Court ordered that the Commissioners modify and change the route of said Embankment, beginning about fifty yards east of the third Bridge, from Jerusalem to as to run across the End of St. S. Pipe to a point between Cypress gut Bridge and Indian gut Bridge, the said Embankment and the Bridge on the same to be built under the direction of said Commissioners. This change to be made provided the increased expense be not to exceed \$100 or damages to St. S. Pipe and \$200 additional charge by the Contractor, and report to Court.

The Court doth appoint James Henry Guardian of James E. Henry, William F. Henry, Thomas J. Henry & Paul W. Henry, Children of J. T. Henry, died and therefore he together with E. A. Henry & Wm. St. Henry his Security, who justified on Cash as to their Sufficiency, entered into and acknowledged a Bond in the penalty of Three Thousand dollars, (conditioned according to law, which Bond is ordered to be recorded.)

On the petition of John L. Everett, who made Oath according to law, and together with H. L. Hill & Wm. E. Myrick his Security, (who justified on Cash as to their Sufficiency,) entered into and acknowledged a Bond in the penalty of Fifteen Hundred Dollars, (conditioned according to law, which Bond is ordered to be recorded.) Certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the Estate of Clarissa H. Hill died in due form.

Ordered that Wm. E. Myrick, Richard A. Barrett and Calhoun Everett, (being first duly sworn for the purpose,) do appraise all the goods and chattels of Clarissa H. Hill died and return the appraisement under their hands according to law.

On the petition of J. P. H. It is ordered that Wm. W. Briggs, Sheriff of this County, take into his hands the Estate of William Prince died.
