Ordered that James M. Corbitt County Treasurer pay to A. Carter the sum of one hundred and eighty five dollars out of the County Levy, for building a bridge and embankment across Mills Creek near Nottoway Mills.

Robert Whitehead Commissioner of roads in Jerusalem Township, this day made his report of the repairs of the Aspsomwick bridge near Spring Hill, which report is ratified and confirmed by the Court. And it is ordered that the said Commissioner take bond and security of the undertaker for the faithful performance of the contract that he receive the work when completed and make report to Court.

The Commissioners heretofore appointed to let to the lowest undertaker the repairs of Flat Swamp bridge near R. S. Thomas's shop. This day made their report which is ratified and confirmed by the Court and ordered to be recorded. And is in these words:-

That the Commissioners appointed October term of Southampton County Court, to let the repairs of Flat Swamp bridge near R. S. Thomas's shop did on the 7th day of November meet and let said bridge to the lowest bidder, James R. Jones being the undertaker for forty dollars, (\$40.00) and also did on the 15th day of November meet at said bridge and receive the work, it being done according to our contract.
