

R. H. Clayton, S. W. Stephens, Wm. R. Richardson, M. W. Butler & M. M. Clayton, who are appointed Commissioners, (any three of whom may act) to examine the route proposed for opening a new road from R. A. Bristow's school house to Ramo Hill bridge, and report to the Court the convenience and inconveniences that will result as well to individuals as to the public. If such road shall be as proposed and especially whether any yard, garden, orchard or any part thereof will in such case have to be taken.

Commissioners heretofore appointed to let the repairs of said bridge across the three creeks, this day made a report which the Court refused to ratify.

On the motion of Thomas R. Bond for the leave to alter the Roads running near his house and through his lands, The Commissioner this day made the following report; at the request of Mr. Thomas R. Bond I have received the road that he made some two or three years ago and in my opinion it is sufficient order to be received and an advantage to the travelling public from the old route between his residence and the Harris plantation. This order of Court is filed herewith.

On Consideration whereof, the Court ratifying and confirming said report doth order that the new road as opened, be established as a public highway, and that the old road be discontinued.

W. Cobb, Wm. A. Bell, Theo. G. Little, Benj. E. Worrell, Wm. N. Sebrell, Henry M. Butts, John A. Sebrell, B. W. Sebrell & Geo. W. Vick his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Forty thousand dollars conditioned according to law which bond is ordered to be recorded. The said James E. Sebrell also took and subscribed the oath required by law.

William W. Briggs who was elected Sheriff of this County by the qualified voters thereof at the election held on the 4<sup>th</sup> day of November 1873, for the term of three years commencing on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January 1874, and after said term of Office shall have expired until his successor is qualified to enter upon the discharge of the duties of said office this day with Wm. Mahone his security entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of twenty thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs which bond is ordered to be recorded.
