Court met according to adjournment

Present The Hon J. W. Ureghart Judge

Joseph B. Prince who was elected attorney for the Commonwealth for the Term of three years commencing on the first day of January 1873 this day qualified by taking & subscribing the oath required by law

On the motion of Mary Stewart widow of Charles Stewart dec'd and for reasons appearing to the Court It is ordered that the order made on the first day of the term committing the estate of Charles Stewart dec'd to the hand of the County for administration be set aside

This day the report of Robert J. Pope, W. E. Edwards and J. R. West Commissioners relative to the repairs of Embankment & bridges at Jerusalem, came on to be heard, and by Consent the Court doth order that the same Commissioners after having given due notice of the time & place proceed to rebid the said work out to the lowest bidder to be completed according to the Specifications filed with the original Contract with John J. Will, taking Bond with approved Security from the Contractor, and the Costs of the new work to be deducted from the amount agreed to be paid by the said several Contracts to John J. Will.

" The Court doth assign J. J. Pitman Committee of Thomas Pitman a lunatic and thereupon the said J. J. Pitman with R. M. Stephenson, W. W. Branch & G. G. Biddle his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of two hundred dollars conditioned according to law.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned until the first day of the next Term.
