

and ascertained said route practicable and usually direct along which said road could be opened for the mutual benefit and convenience of individuals thereon and the public generally; that no yard, garden or part thereof will have to be taken but a part of an orchard, onier consuming, also we beg leave to state the length of said proposed road would be but a mile and a half, and besides opening a highway to several offroad Citizens it would constitute a part of a direct line of public road from Ixor to Franklin and important intervening points forming an equitable triangle with that now existing and thereby saving the length of one side in travelling the estimated costs not exceeding the small sum of Fifty (\$50) dollars -

Furthermore we are so fortunately circumstanced in this the 4th Road district Berlin & Ixor Township in favor of the road workers, their number and the amount of road work necessary at present are largely disproportionate - Respectfully Submitted W. J. Richardson
