Robert Whitehead Commissioner of Roads for Jerusalem Township who was appointed at the last Term of this Court to let the repairs of Colling's Old Mill Bridge, this day made the following report, which is in these words, to wit: "Specifications for rebuilding Colling's Old Mill Bridge. I find it necessary to build the Bridge new. Timbers to be as follows: 15 Sills 12 ft long 10 by 12 in 15 girders 22 ft long 4 by 12 in 10 floorings 10 ft long 2 by 12 in 1 railing 20 ft long 4 by 4 in 2 pieces 21 ft long 4 by 4 in for railing boards. All the above timbers to be of good pine heart. The rebuilding the Bridge by the above Specifications was let to the lowest Underbidder on 8th day of August 1874, the contract to be executed in substantial manner and to be completed by Nov. 1st 1874.
