Joseph W. Urquhart Judge of the County Court of Southampton, In obedience to your Order made at the April Term, We the undersigned Commissioners did proceed to let to the lowest bidder the repairs of Black Crute Bridge, and Salisbury Lewis became the undertaker for the sum of Ninety Nine dollars and Ninety Nine Cents; We beg leave to report that the work has been done according to Contract, and in addition to the work let the said Contractor has done some extra work which was essential to make a permanent job for which we recommended the sum of Two dollars, and Sixty Eight Cents to be paid to the said Contractor." All of which we respectfully recommended to your Honor given under our Signatures as Commissioners this 1st day of August 1874,

Va. We the Commissioners appointed for the letting & receiving of the lower Appamorie Bridge, beg leave to report the work completed satisfactory by J. C. W. Nicholson, the work was first let for \$329 for 107 feet which was found to be entirely too short, and one more span of 23 feet added as a matter of necessity in our opinion for which an additional charge of \$40 is made, which we consider just and right and hope it may meet with the approbation of the Court. This will make the cost of the Bridge with good embankments \$389.00 for 130 feet of bridging and about 5 feet of embankment." All of which is most respectfully submitted. August 14th 1874
