

Reports of the Commissioners made at the last term of the Court relative to the raising of Embankment on the west side of Storroway river, with the view of making a permanent crossing of the said river and low grounds, came on this day to be heard. and it is ordered that Benjamin C. Pope, Joseph H. Dartmouth and Richard H. D. Lytle and John J. Prettus, any three of ^{them}, who are hereby appointed Commissioners for the purpose ~~contract privately or publicly~~ for the repairs and raising of the Embankment and Bridges west from Jerusalem, provided the costs thereof shall not exceed one thousand dollars. And which improvements shall in their opinion be permanent.

Commissioners Appointed to receive Jonas Bridge over the Three Creeks, this day made the report. Wm. Joseph H. Vanequary Judge Southampton Co. Vt. The undersigned Commissioners appointed under the above order did this 2^d day of September 1874 meet at Jonas Bridge, to examine said bridge, the contractor Mr. Dan E. Wallace reported it completed. Upon thorough examination we find it fully up to contract - the specifications are appended, all of which we submit according to order of Court.

Sebrille Commissioner of roads in Edgemoor Township do view the ground and report to the Court the conveniences and inconveniences that will result to individuals as well as to the public, if such road shall be as proposed, and especially whether any yard, garden, orchard or any part thereof ~~shall~~ in such case have to be taken.

E. I. Story, Oswin White and A. G. Pralow Appointed Commissioners to view the road from the Quaker Church, this day made their report. In obedience to an order of the Court of Southampton made at the February Term 1874 your Commissioners proceeded to let said road to the lowest bidder on the 27th of August 1874 which a majority of your Commissioners think was bid off by Satchel Sewin for four hundred and ninety five dollars (\$495.00)
