Griffin agent for John Smith having made complaint on oath before a Justice of the Peace of this County that William Peterson is justly indebted to him ^{for the sum of} one hundred and sixty two dollars and eighty four cents which became payable on the 10th day of February 1874, and that the said William Peterson intends to remove his effects out of this State so that there will probably not be sufficient sufficient effects to satisfy the said claim of one hundred and sixty two dollars and eighty four cents due the said John Smith when Judgment is obtained thereon, Shewed only the ordinary process of law to be used to obtain such Judgment, and the Justice having issued an attachment against the Estate of the said William Peterson in the hands of C.C. This day came the Plaintiff by his attorney and the Defendant through solemnly called came not, whereupon the case is continued until the first day of the next Term of this Court And C.C. Vaughan the quarantined in this case failing to appear it is ordered that he be summoned to the first day of the next Term to answer on oath whether he is indebted to the Defendant or has in his possession or control any money or other effects belonging to the said Defendant
