At the request of the Defendant by his attorney and it appearing to the Court that the Defendant should be admitted to bail he is allowed to give bail, himself to be bound in the sum of fifty dollars with good Security in a like sum of fifty dollars to appear here on the first day of the next term of this Court to answer the indictment of and concerning the offense of which he stands charged and it is ordered that he remain in custody until such bail is given and it is ordered that the case be continued until the first day of the next term.

In the application of ^{Wm} R. Parsons of this County, a Native born Citizen of this Commonwealth, who enlisted in the Service of the Confederate States during the war and has been kept in the Service, the Judge of this Court certifies that the applicant is a resident of this County and has his legs while serving in the Confederate army.

The last Will and Testament of Elizabeth H. Turner was proved by the Oaths of James R. Fennell & H. K. Musgrave the Subscribers witnesses thereof, and ordered to be recorded And Geo. W. Turner the Executor thereof refused to take upon himself the burden of the execution thereof in the petition of Joseph B. Prince who testifies with Joseph H. Prince his Legality, (who justifies on Oath as to his Sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a Bond in the penalty of Five Thousand Dollars Conditioned as the Law directs, which Bond is ordered to be recorded. Certificate is granted the said Joseph B. Prince, for obtaining letters of administration on the Estate of the said Elizabeth H. Turner, with her will annexed in due form.

Ordered that James H. Barnes, David Turner, J. R. Fennell & Peter Turner (or any three of them) being first duly sworn for that purpose, do appraise all the goods & chattels of Elizabeth H. Turner dec'd and return the appraisement under their hands as the Law directs.

Ordered that the sum of Two Hundred and twenty five dollars, be allowed Justice Cost for keeping Smith's Ferry for the year ending the 31st day of December 1875.
