

proceed upon the application aforesaid by Consideration whether and from such facts & records the Court is satisfied that the said Estate is erroneously charged on said Book with taxes amounting to Four dollars & eighty eight Cents, Whereupon it is ordered that the said Estate be exonerated from the payment of four dollars & eighty eight Cents so erroneously charged if not already paid, and if paid, that it be refunded to said Estate.

This day came James E. Harris and Henry Legatus and being at hand of Howell Harris (dec'd) who alleges that they have erroneously assessed about \$6.32 Taxes for County purposes, \$0.45 for free school purposes, and 26 cts for County free school purposes. It is ordered that they be exempt from the payment of said taxes if not already paid, and if paid that they be refunded to said Legatus & being at hand of Howell Harris dec'd.

On Motion, and for reasons appearing to the Court, It is ordered that the two tracts of land charged to the Estate of Mrs. Winney Pettway, one containing 19 1/4 acres at Eight dollars per acre, and the other 158 acres, at three dollars per acre, be for the future charged at no dollar per acre each.
