On the motion of Charles Smith, It is ordered that the Estate of
 Mervin Council do be committed to the hands of W. H. Briggs
 Sheriff of this County, to be administered as the said Council
 being dead and whose name, and no one applying for admin-
 istration on said Estate.

On the motion of Merrick Raiford It is ordered that the Estate of
 Wm B Raiford do be committed to the hands of W. H. Briggs
 Sheriff of this County, to be administered as the said Council
 being dead and whose name, and no person applying for admin-
 istration on said Estate.

T. H. Vaughan is appointed Collector in the Township of Farmington, to fill
 the vacancy created by the failure of the late Collector. Thence to comply with
 the 2^d Section of an act of the General Assembly of Virginia, approved
 February the 23^d, 1875, entitled "An act to amend and re-enact the act for
 extending the time for the collection of Taxes and County and Township dues
 for the year 1874." Whereupon the said T. H. Vaughan together with James
 Vaughan, Seymour Vaughan & Jos. F. Warden his Security, (who justified in
 Oath as to their Sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a Bond
 in the penalty of Five Thousand dollars, conditioned as the law directs,
 which Bond is ordered to be recorded. The said Vaughan also took and
 subscribed the Oath of Office.

On the motion of John W. Harris, who made Oath according to law and
 together with John W. Beaton, his Security, (who justified in Oath as to his
 Sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a Bond in the penalty of
 Three Hundred Dollars, conditioned according to law, which Bond is
 ordered to be recorded. Certificate is granted him for obtaining
 letters of administration on the Estate of Henrietta Harris his
 deceased wife in due form.

The Court doth appoint R. W. Clayton Guardian of W. H. Dwyer
 orphan of James H. Dwyer dec. and therefore he together with J. P.
 Stephenson his Security, (who justified in Oath as to his Sufficiency)
