

and that the places where the said Ordinance and to be kept are convenient and suitable, and that they ^{are} provided with the necessary accommodations for men and horses, as provided in the 19th Section of the act imposing taxes of Approved March 31st 1875, and that the taxes required by law have been paid to the proper Officer.

On the application of Jno. W. Harrison, Geo. F. Harris, who wishes to obtain license to sell by retail ardent Spirits of in this County for the period of twelve months, the said Harrison at Branchville from May 1st 1875 to May 1st 1876 and the said Harris at his Store from the 30th day of April 1875 to the 31st day of April 1876. The Court Certifies from evidence introduced that the places where the stores are to be sold are convenient and suitable, and that the applicants are persons of Sobriety and good Character and that they have paid to the proper Officer the tax required by law to be paid on said license.

By Consent of parties and for reasons appearing to the Court It is ordered that the License granted to Wm. St. Pauling, at the last Term of the Court, be and the same is hereby transferred to M. D. Randle. The Court Certifies from evidence introduced that the place where the same is to be kept, is convenient and suitable, and that the said Randle is a person of Sobriety and good Character, and that he is provided with the necessary accommodations for men and horses, as provided in the 19th Section of the act imposing taxes of Approved March 31st 1875, and that the tax required by law, has been paid to the proper Officer.

The Court doth appoint J. M. Reese, Co. Receiver of the Court No. 19 in the place of J. M. Reese, who declines to act.

On the Motion of Littleton Mangrum, and for reasons appearing to the Court, he is exempted from the payment of Tax and Levies in future he being aged and infirm.

On the Motion of John R. R. Guardian of the Orphans of Jordan W. R. behead died and it appearing to the Court to be necessary. It is ordered that he be authorized to expend the sum of Three hundred dollars of the principal of his ward's Personal Estate in making repairs to the buildings of his said Wards.
