The judgment of the judge of this Court upon the writ of Habeas Corpus ad subjiciendum in the case of Richard Bradshaw, was certified to and received by the Clerk of this Court on the 16th day of June 1875 and is in these words to wit:
 County Court of Southampton County At the Court House - In Vacation -
 June 10th 1875.

In the matter of Richard Bradshaw Petition for writ of Habeas Corpus.
 This cause was this day heard on the petition of the said Richard Bradshaw, the writ of Habeas Corpus ad subjiciendum this day awarded to him, upon the return of Jno P. Williams, Deputy Jailor and the evidence of William L. Howell taken before me Orestes and was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge, and order that the said Richard Bradshaw, colored, is intitled to be released from the jail of the said County on his giving bail in the sum of One hundred dollars Conditioned for his appearance at the next Term of the Circuit Court of said County on the first day thereof, and not depart thence without the leave of the said Court or being otherwise legally discharged. And Salathiel Lewis having acknowledged himself bound in the said sum of One hundred as said bail, and the said Bradshaw having acknowledged himself bound in the sum of One hundred dollars of their respective lands, tenements goods and chattels to be levied in the event of the failure of the said Bradshaw to make his appearance as aforesaid, he is accordingly ordered to be discharged. And it is ordered that the said Richard Bradshaw pay the costs of this proceeding.
