

J. M. A. Bay, who was on the 11th day of May 1875 duly elected
 Representative of the Revenue in the 1st District of the County of
 Southampton by the qualified Voters of the said County to serve as such
 for the term of four years commencing on the first day of July 1875 and
 after the said term of Office shall have expired until his successor is
 qualified to enter upon the discharge of the duties of said Office,
 this day appeared in Court and together with Justice R. Edwards
 J. S. Bay and W. W. Briggs his Sureties (who justified in Court as to
 their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty
 of Three thousand dollars conditioned according to law, which bond is
 ordered to be recorded. And therefore the said Bay took the oaths
 required by law.

John J. Taylor, who was on the 11th day of May 1875 duly elected
 Representative of the Revenue in the 1st District of the County of
 Southampton by the qualified Voters of the said County to serve
 as such for the term of four years commencing on the first day of
 July 1875 and after the said term of Office shall have expired until
 his successor is qualified to enter upon the discharge of the duties
 of said Office this day appeared in Court and together with Justice
 R. Edwards J. W. Briggs his Sureties (who justified in Court
 as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond
 in the penalty of Three thousand dollars conditioned according
 to law, which bond is ordered to be recorded. And therefore
 the said Taylor took the oaths required by law.

The Court upon the recommendation of the County Board of Supervisors
 appointed Oliver L. Hill County Clerk of the County for the term of
 years commencing on the first day of July 1875 and after the said
 term of Office shall have expired until his successor is qualified to
 enter upon the discharge of the duties of said Office this day appeared in
 Court and together with Henry E. Kelly and Robert J. Bryant
 his Sureties (who justified in Court as to their sufficiency) entered
 into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Three thousand
 dollars conditioned according to law, which bond is ordered to
 be recorded. And therefore the said Hill took the oaths
 required by law.

The Court upon the recommendation of the County Board of Supervisors
 appointed John H. Hill County Clerk of the County for the term of
 years commencing on the first day of July 1875 and after the expiration of his term
 he discharged the duties of said Office until his successor
 was qualified to enter upon the discharge of the duties of said Office.
