E. Ficklin Sr., his Surety, (who justified on Oath as to their Sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Five hundred dollars, conditioned according to law, which bond is ordered to be recorded. And thereupon the said Ficklin took the several oaths required by law.

On the petition of Sally Hunt, who repays Oath according to law and together with Thomas Hunt and James Hunt her Sureties, (who justified on Oath as to their Sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of one hundred dollars, which bond is ordered to be recorded. Certificate is granted the said Sally Hunt, for obtaining letters of administration on the Estate of John Hunt dec'd in due form.
