Whereupon came a jury to wit: Frank West, Perry Bradshaw, G. W. Bradshaw, J. Dunn, William Pratt, Lemuel Beale, Frank B. Ross, C. E. Bradshaw, Geo. B. Egan, & W. Johnson, Esq. William on the 14th day when being elected tried and found the truth to speak upon the issue joined upon their Oath de Say: At June Term 1875, the jury recommended to try the defendant, James T. Beach, guilty of Petty Larceny. Given under our hands J. Dunn, Treasurer. Therefore it is considered by the Court that the Defendant be imprisoned in the jail of this County for the period of twenty days and thereafter, until he pay the costs of this prosecution, or be discharged therefrom by due course of law.
