

On the application of James H. Barnes and others Citizens of this County for the purpose of Establishing the "Road leading from the Branchville Road near W. J. Smiths to the Haley's Bridge Road near Hebron Church," as a Public Road It is ordered that Geo. W. Turner, James H. Barnes & Benj. A. Barnes who are hereby appointed Commissioners for the purpose, do view the ground and report to the Court the Commencement and inconveniences that will result as well to individuals as to the public, if such road shall be established as proposed and especially whether any yard, garden, orchard or any part thereof will in such case stand to be taken?

John Fickling Jr. who was on the 27th day of May in the year 1875, duly elected Supervisor in Franklin Magisterial District, in the County of Southampton, by the qualified Voting Electors for the Term of two years Commencing from the first day of July 1875, and after the said Term of Office shall have expired until his Successor is qualified to enter upon the discharge of the duties of said Office, this day appeared in Court and together with John C. Griffing his Security, who justified on Oath as to his Sufficiency, entered into and acknowledged a Bond in the penalty of one Thousand dollars, conditioned according to law, which Bond is ordered to be recorded. And thereupon the said Fickling took the several Oaths required by law.

John C. Griffing, who was on the 27th day of May in the year 1875, duly elected Supervisor in Berlin Magisterial District, in the County of Southampton, by the qualified Voting Electors for the Term of two years Commencing from the first day of July 1875, and after the said Term of Office shall have expired, until his Successor is qualified to enter upon the discharge of the duties of said Office, this day appeared in Court and together with Edw. W. Hervey & John Fickling Jr. his Security (who justified on Oath as to their Sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a Bond in the penalty of one Thousand Dollars, conditioned according to law, which Bond is ordered to be recorded. And thereupon the said Griffing took the several Oaths required by law.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned until the first day of the next Term.
