

The last will and Testament of Can^d Holland dec^d was proved by the Oaths of George E. Beaton and Wm^o E. Beaton the Subscribing witnesses thereto, and Ordered to be recorded. And on the Motion of Narciso S. Holland, the Executor therein named who made Oath according to Law and testified and acknowledged a Bond in the penalty of Five Thousand dollars, Conditioned according to Law, (but without Security the will directing none to be taken, and the Court requiring none,) which Bond is Ordered to be recorded. Certificate is granted the Said Narciso S. Holland for obtaining a precept of the Said Will in due form.

Ordered that Geo. W. Harrison, Geo. E. Beaton & Wm^o E. Beaton, (being first duly sworn for the purpose,) do appraise all the goods and Chattels of Can^d Holland dec^d which may be produced to them, and return the appraisement under their hands as the Law directs.

And I Give the widow of Wm^o J. Gray dec^d re-invested her right to the administration of her said deceased husband's Estate in favor of Robert S. Pope; Whereupon on the Motion of the Said Robert S. Pope, who made Oath according to Law, and together with C. C. Williams and Joseph B. Prince, his Sureties (who justified on Oath as to their Sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a Bond in the penalty of Five Thousand dollars, Conditioned as the Law directs, ^{which bond is ordered to be recorded} Certificate is granted them for obtaining Letters of administration on the Estate of the Said Wm^o J. Gray dec^d in due form.

Ordered that C. C. Williams, Henry Ferguson and Jack West, (being first duly sworn for the purpose,) do appraise all the goods and Chattels of William J. Gray dec^d and return the appraisement under their hands as the Law directs.

The Court doth appoint Thomas Vanyburn, Supervisor in Baykirk's Magisterial District in this County, to fill the vacancy existing in said Office by reason of the failure of said Vanyburn to qualify. Whereupon the Said Vanyburn together with Norfolk B. Ridley his Sureties (who justified on Oath as to his Sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a Bond in the penalty of Five Thousand dollars, Conditioned as the Law directs, which Bond is Ordered to be recorded. The Said Vanyburn, also took the several Oaths required by Law.
