

On the application of James H. Barnes and others to establish the Road lead-
ing from the Brunswick Road near W. L. Smith's to the Stage Bridge Road
near Hebrew Church, the Commissioners appointed at the last Term of this Court
to view the way along which said road is proposed to run, this day made
Report, which is ratified and confirmed by the Court, and ordered to be filed -
In Consideration whereof it is the Opinion of the Court, that the said Road
or parts, be established as a public highway.

On the applications of E. R. Fiercy and Geo. W. Whitfield to establish the Road leading from Jonesville towards Newcom's Depot to a point near Goodwyn's Cutlers, and to connect with the main road leading from Jerusalem, to Fiercy Grove. The Commission^{ers} appointed at the ^{September} last Term of this Court to view the way along which said road is proposed to run, this day made Report, which is read and confirmed by the Court, and ordered to be filed. On consideration whereof it is the opinion of the Court, that the said Road, is to be established as a public highway.

The Commissioners appointed at the June Term last of this Court, to meet and confer
in conjunction with the Commissioners appointed by the County Court of Isle of Wight, in reference to the repairing or rebuilding of Surratt's Bridge this day made their report. Whereupon it is ordered that the said Commissioners to wit, A. S. Stephenson, C. M. Johnson & Geo. W. Spivey do unite with the Commissioners of Isle of Wight County in letting the repairs to said and rebuilding of the Bridge and ^{contracting as agreed upon into a written contract with and} according to their report, to the lowest bidder, that they take Bond and Security from the Undertaker, for the faithful performance of his Contract, receive the work when completed according to Contract, and make report to Court.

Thomas Blount who stands indicted of a felony, was set to the bar in
Custody of the Sheriff of this Court, and being arraigned pleaded not
guilty to the Indictment. And a panel of twenty four jurors summoned
by the Sheriff, after examination by the Court, found free from all legal
exceptions and qualified to serve as jurors according to law. Whereupon
the accused was sworn from the panel eight of said jurors, and from the
remaining sixteen the following twelve jurors were selected by lot, to
whom there ^{was} no objection, to wit; J^r E. Williams, Geo. Hons. Wash-
Gates, J. R. Keller, Geo. W. Stephenson, Edwin Williams, Chas Bradshaw,
Elijah Foxworth, Arnold Kilburn, James S. Williams, Jesse Calkins and
James M. West, who upon sworn the truth of and upon the promises so
spoken, and having heard the evidence upon their Oaths do say, ^{that}
jury find the Prisoner Tom Blount guilty, and ascertain the term of his
imprisonment in the penitentiary to be three years. And therefore it
