

The Court doth appoint Robert Ridley to appraise the value of all lands and lots
 together with the improvements thereon within the Commission District No. 1 in the County
 of Dorchester, to supply the vacancy caused by the resignation of Mr. M. W. W. W. W.
 Whereupon the said Robert Ridley appeared in Court and together with N. B. Rice,
 his security, (who justified on Oath as to his sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged
 a bond in the penalty of Five Hundred dollars, conditioned according to law, which
 bond is ordered to be recorded. And thereupon the said Ridley took the several Oaths
 required by law.

On the Motion of James K. Vick, who made Oath according to law, and together with
 Joel Vick and Elias E. Vick his securities, (who justified on Oath as to their sufficiency)
 entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Five Hundred and fifty dollars,
 conditioned according to law, which bond is ordered to be recorded.
 Certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the Estate
 of Rebecca Vick dec'd in due form.

Ordered that Joel Vick, Elias E. Vick and James K. Vick, being first duly sworn
 for the purpose, do appraise all the goods and chattels of Rebecca Vick dec'd
 and return the appraisement under their hands, as the law directs.

The Report of Surveyors in District No. 30 was returned and ordered to be recorded.

 Districts of Dorchester & Jerusalem into road precincts, and allow the
