Junius Joyner who stands indicted of murder, was set to the bar in custody of the jailor of this Court and being thereof arraigned pleaded not guilty to the indictment and a panel of twenty four jurors summoned by the Sheriff were examined by the Court found from all legal exception and qualified to serve as jurors according to law thereupon the accused waived from the panel eight of the said jurors and from the remaining sixteen the following twelve jurors were selected by lot to whom there was no objection To wit: J. A. Bishop, Walter Bishop, James T. Bloor, Mills & Eloy, W. H. Wagonhart, M. W. Wagonhart, C. G. Williams & Edwards, Warren Edwards, James R. Hunt, D. J. Watkins and W. H. Ferguson who were the truth of and upon the promises to speak and having heard the evidence upon their oaths do say "We the jury find the prisoner not guilty" and thereupon proclamation being made as the manner is and nothing further appearing or being alleged against the prisoner it is ordered that he be acquitted and discharged of the murder aforesaid and go thereof without day

The defendant having served out the term for which he was imprisoned in the jail of this County and it appearing to the Court that he is unable to pay the costs of the prosecution it is ordered that he be discharged from his imprisonment
