

Ordered that Warren Edwards, William Edwards and Robt W. Leroy, be and they are hereby appointed Commissioners to examine and if necessary let to the lowest undertaker the repairs of the Bridge across the Public Road at Mapentwigs Mill and report to Court.

Ordered that J. T. Byrd, A. T. Holt and Gustavus Brattle, be and they are hereby appointed Commissioners to examine and if necessary let to the lowest undertaker the repairs of the Bridge across Swamp Swamp, known as Crumple's Bridge, and make report to Court.

Ordered that F. de Borden and J. T. Byrd and Bartlett Perry, be and they are hereby appointed Commissioners to view and report to Court whether the Road leading from James Holm's to Townkill, and known as the "Perry's Road," should in their opinion be established as a public Road, and whether any appropriation of money will be needed, and if so, how much.

On the Motion of Willis Broadhead, It is ordered that W. B. Briggs, Sheriff of this County, take into his hands the Estate of Jeremiah E. Jagers, dec'd and administer the same as the last directs. The said Jagers having been dead over three months, and no person applying for administration in said Estate.

Robert Ridgely, foreman, E. C. Magat, R. S. Pope, A. S. Pope, J. H. Irving, G. W. Lawrence, Lewis Shuster, and Richard E. Davis, were sworn as ^{Special} Grand Jury of inquiry, for the body of this County, and having received their charge, adjourned, and after Commissions returned into Court, and pronounced.
