

An Inquest taken upon the dead body of Polly Walker, was this day produced to the Court and ordered to be filed.

On this petition signed by fifty qualified voters and more of the Township of Bayard. And it appearing to the Court that notice thereof has been posted for at least thirty days at the Court-house of this County and at the voting places of said Township, and no objection being therein, it is ordered, for good cause shown, that the place for voting in said Township be changed from Oak Grove precinct to Cornell's Store in said Township.

A Writing purporting to be the last Will and Testament of Martha Smith dec^d, bearing date 17th day of June 1863, was this day produced to the Court and ordered to be proved. And Richard B. Ferguson and Miles Cook, the two subscribing Witnesses thereto, who being dead, J. C. Overton and Thos. H. Beaton were sworn as Witnesses and declared that they are well acquainted with the hand-writing of Richard B. Ferguson and Miles Cook and verily believe that the name of the said Richard B. Ferguson and Miles Cook to the said Will subscribed as Witnesses and in their real proper hand-writing, and Mary W. Smith being also sworn as a Witness testified that she was present and the said Witnesses Ferguson and Cook went into the room together to witness the said Will though she did not see them sign their names as such. Whereupon it is ordered that the said Will be received as the true last Will and Testament of the said Martha Smith dec^d. And the Executor named in the said Will being dead, on the motion of Geo. C. Beaton, who ^{made} oath according to law, and together with Augustus Smith and Thos. H. Beaton, his securities, (who put in an oath as his sufficiency), entered into and acknowledged and took in the presence of Geo. Henderson Dolson, Comptroller according to law, which Bond is ordered to be recorded. Certificate is granted the said Geo. C. Beaton for obtaining letters of administration with the Will annexed on the Estate of the said Martha Smith dec^d in due form.

Ordered that Thos. H. Beaton, William Webb and Joel S. Whitcomb, (who being first sworn for the purpose), do and they are hereby directed to appraise all the goods and Chancels of Martha Smith dec^d and make report under their hands according to law.

A Writing purporting to be the last Will and Testament of Peter Beale bearing date on the 4th day of May 1870, was produced, and proved by the oath of Joshua Pretton and of the subscribing Witnesses thereto, and Thos. Duckins the other subscribing Witness thereto being dead, the said Joshua Pretton testified in oath that the said Peter Beale and himself signed their names as Witnesses to the said Will in the presence and the request of the Testator and in the presence of each other. Whereupon it is ordered, that the said Writing be recorded as the true last Will and Testament of the said Peter Beale dec^d.

David Turner, who stands bound by recognizance entered into on the 14 day of December 1870 before a Justice of the Peace for this County, with Peter Dowd, Solomon Hill, Inayat Scott, Austin Chapman, William Clements, Lewis Wood, William Brown, Thos. Hutto and Daniel Chapman, ^{his securities} Comptroller for the personal appearance of the said David Turner, on this day before the Court, to answer a bill of Indictment to be preferred to the Grand Jury against him for a misdemeanor by him committed. And not to depart without the leave of the said Court, was solemnly called out (see Case no. 1). Whereupon it is ordered that a Writ of Habeas Corpus be issued against the said David Turner and his said securities, returnable here to the first day of the
