Henry Stephens who stands indicted of a Felony was again set to the bar in custody of the jailor of this Court, and it being demanded to swear to anything for himself he said he knew to say why the Court had stalled not proceeded to pronounce judgment against him according to law and nothing being offered in excuse of delay of judgment it is considered by the Court that the said Henry Stephens be imprisoned in the Penitentiary of this Commonwealth for the sum of Eighteen months the period to be fixed by the jury in their verdict ascertained.

And it is ordered that the Sheriff of this County do as soon as practicable after the adjournment of this Court, remove and safely convey the said Henry Stephens from the jail of this Court to the Penitentiary of this Commonwealth to be kept imprisoned and treated in the manner directed by law And therefore the said Henry Stephens is remanded to jail.

Sam Long who stands indicted of Burglary was this day set to the bar in custody of the jailor of this Court, and having sworn and pleaded not guilty to the indictment, and a panel of twelve persons of the twenty four summoned by the Sheriff, and examined by the Court and found free from all legal exception and qualified to serve as jury according to law. Jury upon the accused promptly challenged four of the jurors, and the remainder twelve going to Capt. C. A. Ricks, John G. Yates, H. Hollings, R. C. Davis, G. W. Williams, W. L. Williams, C. O. Broadbent, R. S. Hanley, J. L. Danner, Vangie, James Sweeny, G. W. Davis and G. H. Hedges, and eleven tried and sworn, the first of whom upon the inquiry to speak, and having heard the evidence upon this cause do say "We the jury find the Plaintiff not guilty." And thereupon proclamation being made as the manner is, and writing further appearing to have been agreed upon the said Sam Long it is considered by the Court that the said Sam Long be acquitted and discharged of the Burglary aforesaid, and go thereof without day.

Nich Higgins, Geo. H. Vick and Jacob Ricks here in Court separately and individually acknowledged themselves to be indebted to the Commonwealth of Virginia in the sum of one hundred dollars, to be paid of each of their goods and chattels, lands and territories, to the use of the Commonwealth, if they shall make default in the condition under written. The above recognizance is such that if the above Nich Higgins, Geo. H. Vick and Jacob Ricks shall personally appear before this Court on the first day of the next term, then, to give evidence on behalf of the Commonwealth against Alexander Stiles, who stands indicted of murder and shall not depart thence with the leave of the said Court, then the above recognizance to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue.
