

(or any three of them) being duly sworn for the purpose, do approve the goods and chattels of Amos S. Dole, dec'd and return the same under their hands at Court direct.

H. E. Whipple also has been duly licensed to practice the law in the Court of the Commonwealth. He has before long leave to practice in this Court, and therefore he took the Oath required by law.

Aderson Reed, who stands indicted of murder was this day led to the bar in custody of the jailer of this Court, and being thereof arraigned pleaded not guilty to the indictment, and a panel of twelve persons of the County were summoned by the Sheriff, were examined by the Court, found free from all legal exceptions and qualified to serve as jurors according to law. Whereupon the accused summarily challenged four of the jurors and the remaining twelve to wit: V. J. Drury, Isaac Bryant, James M. Barnes, George H. Wiffen, Augustus Crompton, George J. Bryant, John A. Royce, Geo. F. Seaton, D. H. Porter, Dr. H. Lawrence, Allen H. Cotton and S. S. Widley Jr. were called, tried and sworn the truth of and upon the promises to speak and having heard the evidence, were adjourned till tomorrow morning ten o'clock, and thereupon they were given in charge of the Sheriff of this County - Whipple the following oath was administered to Dr. H. Briggs Sheriff of this County and to James H. Hender his deputy, to wit: "You shall keep this jury together and not have any communication with them yourself or permit any other persons to converse or have any communication with them, touching this trial and cause them to appear in Court tomorrow morning at ten o'clock." So held you God." And the prisoner is remanded to jail.

Ordered that the accounts of J. F. McDermott, amounting to the sum of sixteen dollars and seventy five cents and the other amounting to the sum of two dollars and ninety five cents, be certified to the Auditor of Public Accounts for his examination and payment.
