

It is the Opinion of the Court that two guards and 2 keepers to watch the Sheriff of this County in Safety Cause the four Prisoners mentioned to be sent to the Penitentiary of this Commonwealth.

The Court Certified that Benjamin Weston, J. G. Little, M. M. Wagoner, R. Rogers, R. B. Brown, James I. Barden, John Deaking, Wm. E. Maynard, A. H. Grogan & John Pope, are entitled to two dollars each for their services the Court is granted leave to be paid out of the County Treasury.

A License is this day granted to Jack West and Wm. H. Smith as their application to keep an Ordinance at their house in Jerusalem in this County for the period beginning on the first day of May 1876, and expiring on the other side day of April 1877, the Court being fully satisfied that the applicants are persons of Sobriety and good Character and that the place where the said Ordinance is to be kept is convenient and suitable and that they are persons with the necessary accommodations for 99 or a horse, as provided in the 104th Section of the act imposing Taxes &c. approved March 20, 31st 1875, and that the fees required by said law have been paid to the proper Officer.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned until the first day of the next Term.
