

I. C. Cotts, Treasurer, A. J. Gilbert, Cordey to Whitfield. Geo. W. Spring, H. C. Brown, M. H. Chapman and E. B. Beaman were sworn a Special grand jury to inquest for the body to this County, and having received their charge, and after having returned into Court, and presented their indictment against Dick Gray "for Felony" at true bill.

They also made the following presentments, to wit: "On the second day of C. S. Fadden, in the grand jury de present, Five Shovels for entailing, taking up of the 21st inst, an appropriation Five Cows Clements, bound to the County Court of Southampton C. F. Fadden, sworn in Court and Sub to the Grand Jury."

In the evidence to her of our body, I.C. City and
H. J. Giesey, we the grand jury do present James Hedy feet, for making
an apparel and battery on the person of Murphy Hedy feet, on the
9th March 1876, in the County of Southampton.
On the evidence of Mrs B. Bryant and George Stewart, we the grand
jury do present, David Porter for unlawfully carrying about his
person concealed weapons, on the evidence of Mrs B. Bryant and
George Stewart, sworn in Court, and sent to the Gaol.
And the said Grand Jury leaving nothing further to present were discharged.

The Court doth appoint James R. Drown, Guardian of M. Lucy Bond, Appraiser of James H. Bond dec'd. and thereupon the said James R. Drown, together with W. W. Briggs his Security, (who, joined on oath as to his sufficiency), entered into and acknowledged a Bond in the penalty of two dollars, Conditioned as the law directs, which Bond is ordered to be recorded.

The Court do not appoint John E. Finner Guardian of Caroline W. Briggs
(Wife of John E. Briggs) do. and thereupon the said John E. Finner
agrees with Joseph B. Finner and Joseph H. Finner his ~~attorneys~~ ^{attorneys}
the attorney in fact, his Secured, (also justified as Custodian of the
Suffering) enters into and acknowledges a Bond in the pres-
ence of John Thomson Justice, Conditioned as the law directs, which
✓ has a return to be recorded.
