Salathiel Smith, who stands indicted of felony appeared in Court according to the condition of his recognizance entered into on yesterday, and was taken up to the bar in custody of the Sheriff of this County, and the Jury came to try the issue in this Cause appeared in Court according to their summons, and having fully heard evidence, were sent out of Court to consult of their verdict; and after sometime returned into Court, and upon the oath do say: "That the Jury find the prisoner not guilty." And thereupon proclamation being made as the manner is, and nothing further appearing being alleged against the said Salathiel Smith, it is considered by the Court that the said Salathiel Smith be acquitted and discharged of the felony of which he stands charged and go thereof without day.

Edward C. Reddy, who stands indicted of felony this day appeared in Court in discharge of his recognizance entered into before the Criminal Court of this County at the last Term thereof, and was taken up to the bar in custody of the Sheriff of this County, and being arraigned thereof, pleaded not guilty to the Indictment, and a panel of twelve persons of the County in summons by the Sheriff were examined by the Court, found free from all legal exceptions and qualified to serve as jurors according to law. Thereupon the arraigned personably challenged four of the jurors and the remaining twelve to wit: Chas. Bradshaw, Samuel J. Joyner, J. H. Scott, A. S. Cornwell, J. P. Bell, A. D. Kent, C. C. Cornie, R. P. Davis, H. P. Davis, H. P. Saunders, W. B. Forester, J. H. Newton and J. P. Vick, who being called took and sworn the truth of and upon the promise to speak and having heard the evidence upon their oath do say: "That the Jury find the prisoner not guilty." And thereupon proclamation being made as the manner is, and nothing further appearing or being alleged against the said Edward C. Reddy, it is considered by the Court that the said Edward C. Reddy be acquitted and discharged of the felony of which he stands charged and go thereof without day.
