On the motion of the attorney for the Commonwealth as for reasons
appearing to the Court, this case is continued until tomorrow morning
the 26th.

Henrichs Magee were in Court, Separately and individually acknowledged
themselves to be indebted to the Commonwealth of Virginia, in the sum of
one hundred dollars, to be levied each, of their goods and chattels, lands
and tenements, to the use of the Commonwealth, if they shall make default
in the Condition hereinafter. The above recognizance is such, that if
the above W. B. Saunders, R. B. Davis, E. W. Critchton, Geo. James, W. W. Warren
and Henrichs Magee, shall personally appear before this Court on
tomorrow morning the 26th, to give evidence in behalf of the Commonwealth
against Richard Gray who stands Indicted of Felony and shall not
