The Court certifies that L. C. Cobb, foreman, A. L. Doolittle, Cordy C. Whiffles, Geo. H. Spring, W. C. Moore, W. C. Clayton and E. D. Treaton are allowed one dollar each for their services this term at Grand Jurors, to be paid out of the County Treasury.

R. P. Davis, W. P. Saunders, C. S. Eley, D. T. Webb, J. W. Gray, J. C. Smith, Chas. Goodrich, A. S. Cornwell, John Camp, S. H. Scott, A. J. Rogers and D. W. Cornwell are allowed one dollar each for their services this term as Jurors in the prosecutions for misdemeanors, to be paid out of the public treasury.

James C. Hill, Surveyor of this County, this day made a report, specifying in meters and bounds of a certain tract of land charged on the 11th of March 1870, sold on the 15th of December 1873 for the non-payment of taxes thereon in the year 1874, and purchased by Samuel Pauls according to the provisions of Section 19, Chapter 38, Code of Virginia 1873, which is about to be recorded.

Ordered that Sam Stewart, James Hedyforth and David Porter be summoned to appear here on the first day of the next term to show cause if any thing can, why Informations should not be filed against them upon the presentments of the grand jury made against them on the first day of this term.

Ordered that James Drewry, guardian of James C. Drewry, Thos. J. Drewry and Paul H. Drewry, be allowed to expend one hundred dollars of the principal of each of his said wards personal estate for their support, clothing and education for the year 1875 and 1876.

Dick Gray, who stands indicted of felony was this day led to the bar in custody of the Sheriff of this Court and being thrice arraigned pleaded not guilty to the Indictment, and a panel of sixteen jurors of the County summoned by the Sheriff, were examined by the Court, found free from all legal objections and qualified to serve as jurors according to law. Thereupon the accused respectfully challenged four of the jurors and the remaining twelve to wit: C. S. Eley, A. S. Cornwell, Charles Summers, D. C. Carr, G. P. Rogers, Jas. P. Webb, Saml. Whitley, Wm. Goodrich, D. H. Scott, Charles Goodrich, James Camp and C. S. Eley, who being elected tried and sworn the truth of what was promised to speak, and having heard the evidence upon their oath they say: "That Jerry Gray the prisoner guilty and fined his term of confinement in the penitentiary for 5 years, and on the opinion of the jury Richard Gray, on his receding appearing to the Court, it is ordered that the said verdict be set aside, and that a new trial be had upon the Indictment aforesaid. And thereupon he is removed to jail."

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
