And thereafter the said Dick Gray is remanded to jail.

William Richardson, also stands Indicted of Felony, was this day led to the bar in Custody of the Jailor of this Court, and having thereof arranged pleaded not guilty to the Indictment, and a panel of twelve persons of the shire was summoned by the Sheriff, and examined by the Court found free from all legal exception and qualified to serve as jurors according to law. Thereupon the accused presumptuously challenged four of the jury, and the remaining twelve, to wit, A. B. Smith, Caleb Smith, W. D. Dyer, Henry Ferguson, Richard St. Louis, J. R. Scarborough, J. H. Woodward, L. J. Dore, James Bryant, A. S. Stephenson, Geo. H. Stephenson, and Joseph J. Gray, who being elected, tried and sworn the Court do and upon the promise to speak, and having heard the evidence, upon their oath do say: "We the jury find the accused guilty, and ascertain the term of his imprisonment as the Penitentiary of this Commonwealth, to be two years." And thereafter, it being demanded of him, the said William Richardson if anything for himself he had a hard to say, why the Court have shown not word proceed to pronounce judgment against him according to law, and nothing being offered or alleged in defence of judgment, it is considered by the Court, that the said William Richardson be imprisoned in the Penitentiary of this Commonwealth for the term of two years, the period by the jury in their verdict ascertained. And it is ordered, that the Sheriff of this County do as soon as possible after the adjournment of this Court, remove and safely convey the said William Richardson from the jail of this Court, to the Penitentiary of this Commonwealth, thence to be kept imprisoned and treated in the manner directed by law. And thereafter the said William Richardson is remanded to jail.
