

Honestly he had or knew to say, why the Court had shamed in some persons

where to be kept imprisoned and treated in the manner directed by law.
And whereupon the said Dick Gray, is remanded to jail.

to the bar in Custody to the jailor of this Court, and being there
arraigned pleaded not guilty to the Indictment, and a panel of twelve
persons, of the thirty six, Summoned by the Sheriff, upon examination by

Stephens, Jas. H. Stephenson, and Joseph J. Gray, were being elected
