

Challenged four of the jurors and the remaining twelve, to-wit: L. S. Davis, David Bradshaw, Frank Jagger, George Scale, James Bishop, J. H. Williams, Jno. H. Harrison, Th. O. Bradshaw, Th. A. Schmitt, J. P. Gay, Edwin Williams and Coley Bryant, who being challenged, had heard the evidence, upon their oath do say: "That the jury find the prisoner guilty, and ascertain his term of imprisonment to be three years in the penitentiary." And it being demanded of him, whether the Court here should not now proceed to pronounce judgment against him according to law, and nothing being offered or alleged in delay of judgment, it is considered by the Court that the said Jno. Daughtrey, being imprisoned in the penitentiary of this Commonwealth for the term of three years the period by the jury in their verdict ascertained. And it is ordered that the Sheriff of this County do, as soon as possible after the adjournment of this Court, remove and safely convey the said Jno. Daughtrey from the jail of this County to the penitentiary of this Commonwealth, there to be kept and treated in the manner directed by law. Thereupon the prisoner is remanded to jail.

Ordered that the following accounts, to-wit: One in favor of Jas. C. Schmitt, County Treasurer amounting to forty eight dollars, and in favor of David Davis, attorney for the Commonwealth for Southampton County, amounting to forty five dollars and one in favor of Th. H. Briggs Sheriff of Southampton County, amounting to nine dollars, be certified to the Auditor of Public Accounts for his examination and payment.

The Commissioners appointed at the December term of this Court 1875 to let the repairs of Bridges across Flat Swamp, this day made report which was ratified and confirmed by the Court and ordered to be filed.

It is the opinion of the Court that two guards are necessary to enable the Sheriff of this County to remove and safely convey the four prisoners now in jail from the jail of this County to the penitentiary of this Commonwealth.

Ordered that the Jailor of this County procure four efficient guards to guard the jail during the confinement of the prisoners therein, commencing at the first day of the term.

Samuel Wells late Sheriff and Administrator do laid now with the will annexed of Samuel S. Putts dec'd being dead, on the motion of J. D. Parsons it is ordered that Th. H. Briggs Sheriff of this County, take the administration of Samuel S. Putts dec'd into his hands, and administer the same according to law.
