

promises to speak and having heard the evidence upon this, and he say: "We the Jury find the prisoner guilty and ascertains the term of imprisonment in the penitentiary to be five years." And thereupon it being of him, if anything for himself he had to say, he said he would now should not now proceed to pronounce judgment against him according to law, and nothing being offered or alleged in delay of judgment, it is considered by the Court, that the said David Peters be imprisoned in the penitentiary of this Commonwealth for the term of five years as provided by the jurors in their verdict ascertained. And it is intended, in this Court remove and safely convey the said David Peters from the jail of this County to the penitentiary of this Commonwealth, thence to be kept imprisoned and treated in the manner directed by law. And thereupon the said David Peters is remanded to jail.

Henry Mason who stands indicted of felony was this day led to the bar in Court of the Judges of this Court, and being asked ~~pleaded~~ pleaded not guilty to the indictment, and a panel of twelve jurors of the shire then summoned by the Sheriff, were examined by the Court, found free from all legal exceptions and qualified to serve as jurors according to law. Thereupon the accused peremptorily challenged four of the jurors, and ~~was~~ was sworn twelve to wit, Edward Williams, John G. Bell, Geo. C. Lodge, B. F. Bell, James Lewis, J. C. Carson, Alexander Knight, Lewis Clarke, L. J. Smith, Geo. W. Dick, and L. H. Davis, who being elected, tried and sworn the truth of and upon the promises to speak and having heard the evidence upon this Court do say, "We the Jury find Henry Mason guilty, and ascertains his term in the Penitentiary for ten years." And thereupon it being demanded of him the said Henry Mason, if anything for himself he had to say, he said he would now should not now proceed to pronounce judgment against him according to law, and nothing being offered or alleged in delay of judgment, it is considered by the Court, that the said Henry Mason be imprisoned in the Penitentiary of this Commonwealth for the term of ten years as provided by the jurors in their verdict ascertained. And it is intended, in this Court remove and safely convey the said Henry Mason from the jail of this County to the Penitentiary of this Commonwealth, thence to be kept imprisoned and treated in the manner directed by law. And thereupon the said Henry Mason is remanded to jail.

Ordered that the account of B. F. McQuinn Comptroller amounting to thirty two dollars and fifty cents be certified to the Auditor of Public Accounts, for his Examination and payment.

Ordered that the account of Wm. H. Reitz Sheriff of this County amounting to eight ^{and} four dollars be certified to the Auditor of Public Accounts, for his Examination and payment.

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On the 11th of the month of January, the Court granted the writ of Habeas Corpus to the said Henry Mason.

It is the order of the Court that the Sheriff of this County be paid the sum of ten dollars for his services.

The Court do hereby certify that the said Henry Mason is a free man, and entitled to the same rights and privileges as other citizens of this Commonwealth.

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
