The 1st day of September 1874, whereof the Defendant was found guilty and sentenced to imprisonment in the County Jail, for the term of ten months. On the day came the attorney for the Commonwealth, and the Defendant appeared in discharge of his recognizances entered into before the Court, and was set to the bar in Custody of the Sheriff of the County, and thereupon a Jury to wit, Alexander Knight, Jas. H. Peck, James E. Carden, W. H. Fair, Henry L. Smith, William H. Himmens, R. L. Hurdley, Henry Heth, C. C. Richs, R. J. Williams, James Bristol, who were elected tried and heard of, and upon the opening to speak and having heard the evidence upon their Oaths do say "That the Jury find the evidence to sustain the term of his imprisonment in the County Jail, for the term of ten months," and thereupon it being considered of the Prisoner if he should for himself be heard or heard to say why the Court should not proceed to pronounce judgment against him according to law, and having being offered or alleged in delay of judgment, it is considered by the Court, that the Defendant be imprisoned in the Jail of the County for the term of ten months, the period by the Jury in their verdict ascertained, and thereafter until he pays the Costs of the prosecution or is otherwise discharged by due Course of law. And it is further considered by the Court, that the said Jas. H. Jeynes receive in his bare back, previous to his discharge, to be inflicted by the Sheriff of this County, twenty lashes at the public whipping post.
