Amos Jagers, who stands indicted & felony was again led to the bar in
custody of the Sheriff of this County, and the jury sworn yesterday for his trial
were brought into Court by the Sheriff of this County and were sent out of Court
to Council of their verdict and after sometime returned into Court and upon
their Verdict de Say, "We the jury find the Prisoner guilty and ascertain the
term of his Confinement in the Penitentiary to be ten years; We also find
that said Prisoner has been once before Convicted and Sent to the Peniten-
tiary." And it being demanded of him the said Amos Jagers, if
anything for himself he had or knew to say, why the Court here should
not proceed by pronounced judgment against him according to law and
justice being offered or alleged in delay of judgment, it is ordered
by the Court that the said Amos Jagers be imprisoned in the Penitentiary by
Committment for the term of ten years, the period of the years in that
Verdict ascertained, and it appearing to the Court that the said Amos
Jagers has been before sentenced in the United States to a life peniten-
tiary, therefore it is considered by the Court that the said Amos Jagers
be confined in the Penitentiary of this Commonwealth for a term
Term of five years, to Commence from and after the expiration of
the period of his Confinement under the Sentence of the Court
also ascertained. And it is ordered that the Sheriff of this County
do as soon as possible after the adjournment of this Court remove and
safely convey the said Amos Jagers from the Jail of this Court to
the Penitentiary of this Commonwealth therein to be kept imprisoned
treated in the manner directed by Law And thereupon the said Amos
Jagers is remanded to jail.

Thomas Jeynes alias Acton, Henry Jeynes and Thomas Jeynes alias Actis, who stand indicted jointly with Charles Jeynes for perjury, are on day set to the bar in Court-day of the jail of the Court, and the attorney for the Commonwealth with the agent of the Court said to will not further prosecute against the Defendants upon the Indictment aforesaid. And proclamation being made in the manner to be in nothing further being alleged or appearing against the Prisoners it is ordered that they be discharged from Custody.
