

Peace, rendered on the 23. day of August 1874,

 County Jail for the term of 30 days. This day came the attorney for the County
 undersigned and the Defendant appeared in discharge of his recognizance entered
 into before a Justice of the Peace, and was set to the bar in Courtroom of the
 Sheriff of this County, and thereupon came the following jury, to wit: Brijg.
 Bryant, Ely Bryant, Caleb Everett, W. L. Stephenson, R. K. Williams,
 Worthy Parkman, J. L. Hiddle, S. B. Easton, M. L. Jagers, J. W. Miller,
 James Gray, and William Williams, who being selected tried and
 returned, and upon the foreman's request and having heard the evidence
 upon their oath do say, "We the jury find the Defendant not guilty."
 Whereupon it is considered by the Court that the said J. L. Hiddle, be
 acquitted and discharged of the offense aforesaid, and go thereof without
 delay.

Ordered that the account of ^{James J. P. Miller} late adm^r of the will of the estate of Jonathan
 P. Miller dec^d being dead, on the motion of ^{J. L. P. Miller} it is ordered that W. L. P. Miller
 Sheriff of this County, take into his hands, the Estate of Jonathan
 P. Miller dec^d and administer the same, according to law.

Ordered that the account of Amos Edwards Special Constable, am-
 t. u. u. - making 36 Ten ⁴⁰per dollars be Certified to the Auditor of Public
 Brijg - Payments for his examination and paym^{ts}.

Ordered that the account of J. B. Brown, attorney for the
 to u. u. + Commonwealth for this County amounting to ten dollars, be Certified
 Brijg - to the Auditor of Public Payments for his examination & paym^{ts}.

The Court Certifies that William Wagoner, Sec. of Lawrence, C. C. Williams,
 J. W. Williams, Charles Vaughan, R. K. Brinson, Lawrence Neal & H. B.
 Kindred and entitled to two dollars each for their services this term,
 as grand jurors to be paid out of the County treasury.

The Court Certifies that Brijg. J. Bryant, Ely Bryant, Caleb Everett,
 W. L. Stephenson, R. K. Williams, Worthy Parkman, J. L. Hiddle, S. B.
 Easton, M. L. Jagers, J. W. Miller, James J. Gray,
 William Williams, John D. McMeas,
 and J. W. Whitley and entitled to two dollars each for their services
 this term, as jurors in the trial of prosecutions for Wagoner & c., to
 be paid out of the Public Treasury.

It appearing to the Satisfaction of the Court that Jane Griffin, who is confined
 in the jail of this County as a Lunatic, is restored to sanity It is therefore
 ordered, that she be discharged from her Confinement, and be furnished with
 a copy of this Order.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till first day of next Term.
