Estlin, Jr., a Justice of the Peace of this County, and was set to the bar in Courtroom of the Sheriff of this County, and thereupon came a jury to wit, Samuel Dwyer, Jos. J. Sargent, J. R. Kelly, both appointed, J. P. Edwards, Jos. J. Sargent, R. H. Rauls, A. A. Williams, W. H. White, Lewis Whitfield, R. H. Lee and Henry Simpson, who were sworn, bid and sworn the truth of and upon the promises to speak, and having heard the evidence upon this case do say "If the jury find the Defendant guilty, and find him to be, he is and thereupon being demanded of the Jurors, if anything for himself he has to say, why the Court should not send proceed to pronounced judgment, against him, according to law, and nothing being offered or alleged in delay of judgment, it is considered by the Court that the Commonwealth recedes against the defendant in the fine specified is assessed, and the Costs of this prosecution, and it is further considered by the Court that the defendant be confined in the jail of this County for the period of thirty days, and thereupon until he pay the fine and Costs assessed, or is otherwise discharged by due course of law.
