

Virginia, 1874 & 75

The J. Carver, Surveyor of the road, from the North Carolina line, on the Road Bridge road, came to King's River, being received at the other day, and the resignation, which the Court accepted.

The Court did appoint Samuel Hill, Surveyor of the Road from the North Carolina line on the Road Bridge road, to King's River, being received at the other day, in Baykin's Magisterial District.

The hands of the hands of Mary Chappes & Lewis Rodbeck, are appointed to work on the road from Diamond Bridge, to the North Carolina line, of which R. B. Regan is Surveyor.

The Court did appoint James J. Darden, R. E. Darden & J. I. Butler, who are appointed Commissioners for that purpose, examine the Bridge over Vick's Mill near Mary's River, gate, let the repairs of the same to the Court under the hands of the repairs to Court.

On the motion of Charles C. Knight, J. P. Brown, John I. Conwell, Dennis Clayton (Col.) & Archer Cook (Col.) and for reasons appearing to the Court, they are severally exempted from the payment of taxes & fees in future, they being aged & infirm.

James C. Smith, Treasurer of this County, this day presented to the Court a list of delinquents in the taxes for the year 1876, in the amount of \$100.00, & the Court, after the Court of the said Treasurer, at the first time, submitted, & accompanied by the County Officer.
