

Ordered that R. C. Dine, J. P. Raulo & C. R. Raulo be appointed Commissioners to let to the lowest undertaker the repairs of the Bridge across Searach Swamp known as Crumpled Bridge & also the repairs of the Embankment there of report to Court.

Ordered that J. H. Applewhite, Geo. M. Hughes & P. S. Thomas be appointed Commissioners to let to the lowest undertaker the repairs of the Bridge across Mafon's Mill Swamp, & report to Court.

E. K. Foss Surveyor of the Road from Mount Herbs Church to Monroe Ferry, this day tendered his resignation, which the Court accepts.

On the petition of W. M. Hall & A. P. Dancy, Solicitors for George Carson in his Official land as Constable in Wayne's Magistrate District in this County to be relieved from such liability, it is ordered that the said Carson be summoned to the next term of this Court to show Cause if any he can why he should not be valued to give a bond here, in the same manner as if he had been given.

The account of M. S. Butler Justice of the Peace of acting Constable amounting to five dollars is allowed, & ordered to be certified to the Board of Supervisors for payment.

An Inquest taken over the body of an Unknown Child, was returned & ordered to be filed.

On the petition of Joseph O'Connor of Cork; It is Ordered that Justice E. Johnson be summoned to the next term of this Court to show Cause if any he can why he should not be removed as Surveyor of the Road from Joseph O. Harwood to Smith's Ferry.

R. B. Pickett Surveyor of the road from Pickett's Bridge to Hand Lovers Branch this day tendered his resignation which the Court accepts.

William Winford is appointed Surveyor of the road from Pickett's Bridge to Hand Lovers Branch, in the place of R. B. Pickett this day resigned.

D. B. Henderson Justice of the Peace of this County this day paid into Court by the Clerk thereof, Ten dollars fine against Albert Turner for a misdemeanor by him committed.

Richard Warren Oplem of Richard Raulo died One year & 4 days ago, at the appointment of the Court this day, reads claim of L. C. City as his Executor & thereupon the said City, together with C. C. Daughan, his Secretary, were justified in Court as to their sufficiency, entered into & acknowledged a bond in the penalty of One hundred dollars, conditioned as the law directs, which bond is ordered to be recorded.
