And thereupon proclamation being made as the manner is, & nothing further appearing or being alleged against the said W. H. Finch, it is considered by the Court that the said W. H. Finch, be acquitted and discharged of the Misdemeanor of which he stands charged, & go thereof without day.

Junius Paolo, who stands indicted for felony, this day appeared in Court in discharge of his recognizances entered into before David H. Hendon and R. P. Barrett, two Justices of the Peace of this County, & was led to the bar in Custody of the Sheriff & being there arraigned pleaded not guilty to the Indictment, & a panel of twelve persons of the County, summoned by the Sheriff, were examined by the Court, found free from all legal exceptions, & qualified to serve as jurors according to law. Thereupon the accused presumptively challenged four of the jurors, & the remaining twelve, to wit, B. E. Bryant, J. H. Johnson, J. W. Weston, D. K. Griffin, Geo. W. Harrison, Geo. H. Richardson, Geo. T. Camp, Oley Bryant, James B. Patton, Charles Barkham, Edwin Williams & V. H. Cobb, who having elected trial & sworn the truth to and upon the promise to speak, & having heard the evidence upon their Oaths do say, "We the Jury find the Prisoner not guilty." And thereupon proclamation being made as the manner is, & nothing further appearing or being alleged against the said Junius Paolo, it is considered by the Court that the said Junius Paolo, be acquitted & discharged of the felony of which he stands charged, & go thereof without day.

Ordered that the following accounts to wit, One in favor of W. W. Briggs to W. W. Briggs Sheriff of this County amounting to Sixteen "700 dollars, One in favor of James E. Sebell, Treasurer of this County, amounting to Thirty Six dollars, One in favor of Joseph B. Prince, Attorney for the Commonwealth in this Court, amounting to Forty dollars be formally certified to the Auditor of Public Accounts, for his examination & payment.

Ordered that James E. Sebell, Treasurer of this County, out of the to W. W. Briggs County levy, pay W. W. Briggs the sum of Forty Nine dollars, the amount of his account for expenses in conveying Prisoners to & from the Jail of Peterborough & Suffolk.

Ordered that James E. Sebell, Treasurer of this County, out of the County levy, pay the following accounts to wit, One in favor of J. B. Patton, for four dollars each, One in favor of William Williams, Thomas Langham, & John J. H. Peterson, for two dollars each, & One in favor of Josephine T. Howard amounting to four dollars, the same being for conveying Prisoners, & for the board of said gaol.

Ordered that W. W. Williams who was appointed a Constable to his the harbor of the Embankment on the West Side of Pottery River, & receive the same when completed according to Contract, this day made Report.
