

James, R. T. Well, David Gray, J. A. Knight and J. S. Russell, who being elected, tried and sworn the truth of and upon the promises to speak, and having heard the evidence upon their oaths do say: "The jury find the prisoner guilty and sentenced him to State Penitentiary for one year." And it being demanded of him, if any thing for himself, he had or time to say, why the Court here should not now proceed to pronounce judgment against him according to law, and nothing being offered or alleged in delay of judgment, it is considered by the Court, that the said George Thomas James be imprisoned in the Penitentiary of this Commonwealth for the term of one year the period by the jury in their verdict ascertained. And it is ordered that the Sheriff of this County do, as soon as possible after the adjournment of this Court, remove and safely carry, ^{the said George Thomas James} from the jail of this Court to the Penitentiary of this Commonwealth, therein to be kept imprisoned and treated in the manner directed by law. And thereupon, the said George Thomas James is removed to jail.

Nick Kindred who stands indicted of felony was led to the bar in custody of the jailer of this Court, and being ^{arraigned} pleaded not guilty to the indictment, and a panel of sixteen persons of the thirty six, summoned by the Sheriff, were examined by the Court, found free from all legal exceptions and qualified to serve as jurors according to law: Thereupon, the accused peremptorily challenged four of the jurors and the remaining twelve, to wit: J. B. Weston, C. H. Hart, Jonas R. Ingalls, C. H. Halcorn, W. H. Urquhart, Wm. S. Williams, Jas. R. Larkin, C. D. Story, Edwin Bradshaw, E. C. Cope, C. J. Norris and Jas. W. Pittman, who being elected, tried and sworn the truth of and upon the promises to speak, and having heard the evidence upon their oaths do say: "The jury find the prisoner guilty and upon his term in the Penitentiary one year." And thereupon, it being demanded of him, if any thing for himself, he had or time to say, why the Court here should not now proceed to pronounce judgment against him according to law, and nothing being offered or alleged in delay of judgment, it is, therefore, considered by the Court, that the said Nick Kindred be imprisoned in the Penitentiary of this Commonwealth for the term of one year, the period by the jury in their verdict ascertained. And it is ordered, that the Sheriff of this County do, as soon as possible after the adjournment of this Court, remove and safely carry, the said Nick Kindred, from the jail of this Court to the Penitentiary of this Commonwealth, therein to be kept imprisoned and treated in the manner directed by law. And thereupon, the said Nick Kindred is removed to jail.
