John P. Taylor, Jr., Guardian of Richard H. Cott, Annie La Cott, & Caroline F. Cott, having this day returned an account of his transactions as such Guardian to the Court, the Court without confirming the said account, at this time, (the same not having) been in the Clerk's Office thirty days for completion, doth Order that the said Guardian retain in his hands the sum of Two hundred dollars, ^{to} each, to pay, ^{each} said Ward's Current expenses for the present year, and that the said Guardian invest in either Richmond City or Norfolk City bonds, (at his discretion) the sum of One Thousand Dollars, ^{to} each, said Ward's benefit.

On the motion of Franklin Pope Guardian of Mary C. Pope, grand child of Anne Pope doth the Court Order that he be allowed by separate account two dollars, of the principal of his Ward's personal estate for her support, maintenance & education for the year 1877, & the like sum of Two hundred dollars, of her said principal, for the same purposes, for the present year, 1878.

Ordered that B. T. Fox, J. J. Whitbrook, & Rufus Tanner, be and they are hereby appointed Commissioners to view a new route for a Road from the Jerusalem Road near Courthouse to some point on the Railroad Road, between Wm. H. Grange & James Grange. The said Commissioners will report the facts to enable the Court to determine the expediency of establishing or altering the road. They will also examine other routes ~~than~~ the one proposed, if desired, & report all the facts. They will also report the names of the land owners on the route, and State which of them require compensation & what probable amount thereof. And if they adopt a new Road, also report whether it crosses any yard, orchard or Garden.

Ordered that A. S. Stephenson, H. L. Nelson, Joseph L. Canine, be and they are hereby appointed Commissioners to ascertain whether a Bridge is necessary at the place called Black Hill, near Black Water Bridge, & if necessary, whether or not it can be built by the Owners of the Road, & if not practicable for the Owners of the Road to build, & the said Bridge is necessary, the said Commissioners will let the building of the same, & the putting & put plants on Black Water Bridge, to the lowest Under-taker, and report to Court.
