It is the Opinion of the Court that One guard is necessary to enable the Sheriff of this County to safely carry the Prisoners sentenced at this term to the Penitentiary of this Commonwealth.

Vick, in their application to Sell by Retail, only in quantities up to five gallons at any one time to any one individual, Wine, Ardent Spirits, Malt Liqueurs, Cider, or any Mixture thereof, at their several places of business in this County, which shall be drunk within the limits of their respective places where sold, but shall be delivered to the purchaser in bottles, jug, demijohns, or other vessels, to be removed therefrom, for the period beginning on the 1st day of May 1878, and expiring on the shortest day of April 1879; the Court being fully satisfied that the applicants are fit persons, and that their places of business are suitable and convenient, and the applicants having executed a bond as required by law, with good Security, payable to the Commonwealth of Virginia, in a penalty of Five hundred dollars, Conditioned for the faithful performance of all the requirements of the Act of the General Assembly of Virginia, entitled, "An act imposing a tax and prescribing the mode of collecting the same, on the privilege of selling Wine, Ardent Spirits, or Malt Liqueurs, within the limits of the Commonwealth for the support of the Government, and to pay the interest on the public debt," approved March 30th 1877, as amended by the act approved April 2nd 1877.
